What You Need

- Printer and/or copier
- Stapler
- Crayons

1. Print a book for each Cubbie. Also print a book for any leaders who will read the book to Cubbies. The pages should be landscape in orientation. Print or copy pages double-sided to save paper.
2. Staple along the left side of the book as a binding.
3. In handbook groups, a leader should read the entire book to Cubbies as they turn pages along with the leader. Then Cubbies may color the pages. The leaders should help Cubbies follow the specific coloring directions on each page.

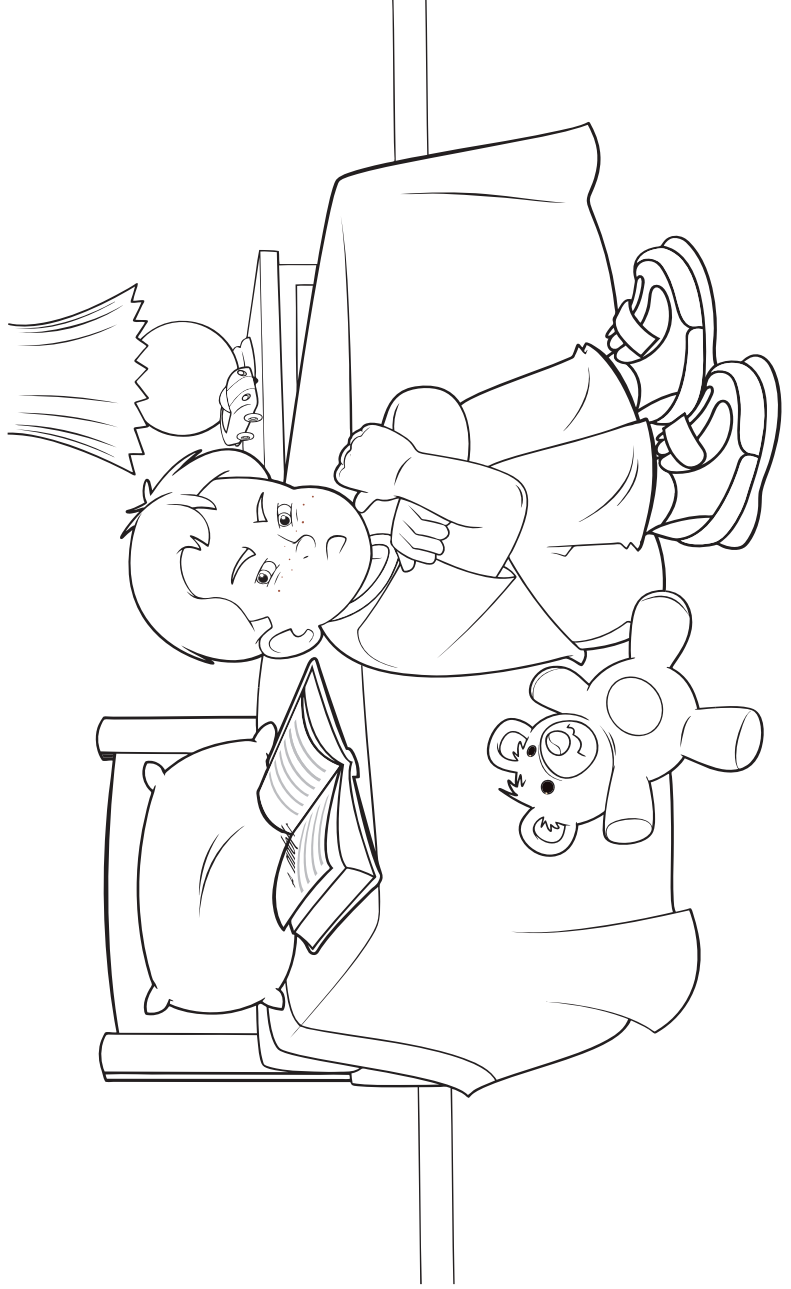
Color Amy's skin and the children's skin brown.

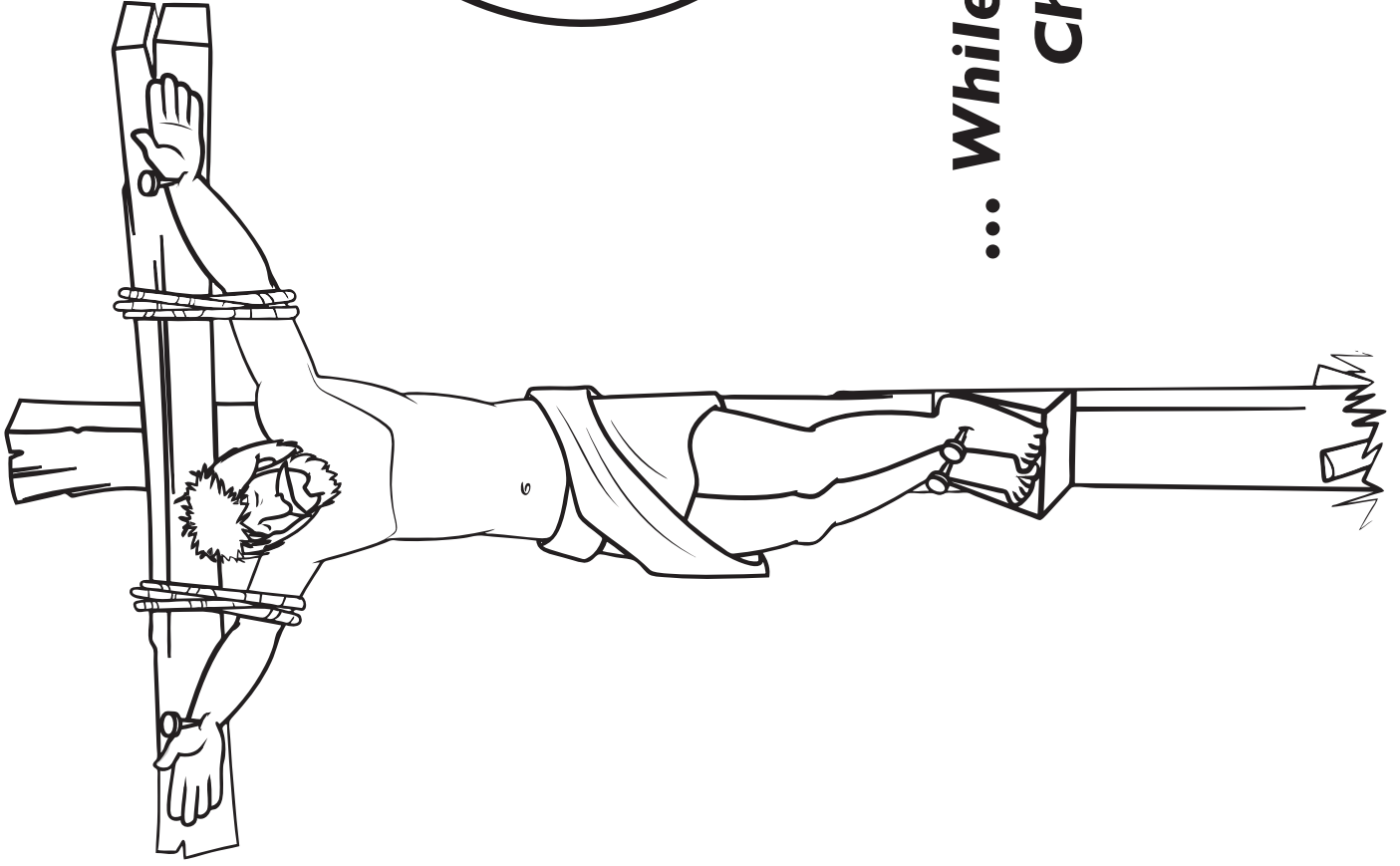
